Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage in the Michigan Basin

ABSTRACT

The Michigan Basin has been identified as one of the top locations for large-scale storage of CO₂ in the United States and will be a key contributor to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and meeting state and national climate goals. This presentation will provide an overview of the Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage (CCUS) process and review the work which laid the foundation for CCUS in Michigan. We will explore the top opportunities for storage, including saline reservoirs and depleted oil and gas fields, unexplored and potential reservoirs, data gaps, and upcoming research.

BIOGRAPHY

Autumn Haagsma is the Director of the Michigan Geological Repository for Research and Education and Assistant Director of the Michigan Geological Survey. She is responsible for leading research, team building, conducting outreach and engagement, and mentoring and training students. Prior to her current role, Autumn was a lead geologist at Battelle focusing on CCUS research including reservoir characterization, 3D modeling, risk assessments, data analytics, and outreach. Autumn is also a PhD candidate at Miami University, earned her M.S. in geophysics from University of Minnesota, and B.S. in geology and physics from Central Michigan University.

A Note from Jen Trout

At our July 11th meeting of the executive committee, we announced that Autumn Haagsma, new director of MGRRE, had volunteered to be our Alternate House of Delegates delegate at the June 1, 2023 HOD meeting. At the HOD meeting, they talked about how Eastern Section AAPG has been having trouble getting volunteers to host the annual meetings. They have discussed going to every other year for ESAAPG meetings with only workshops or a field-based event in between. Autumn suggested that Michigan could host a workshop titled **"Back to the Rocks"** in the spring of 2024. However, these types of events are required to have an affiliated society lead the planning. Autumn negotiated that MBGS would receive 65% of the profits. She asked if MBGS would be willing to help with this since they are the affiliate society in Michigan. MBGS was also approached by William Rose for a donation toward a Jacobsville Sandstone historical marker in the UP. The exec comm was willing to put forth \$500 for this cause, keeping in mind that we still need to raise funds for the Jackson coal historical marker. Jen T will also ask W Rose if he would be willing to lead a field trip when the marker is installed. Speaking of the Jackson coal marker, Bennie See has completed the paperwork and sent it to the exec com. We will start fundraising after we get approval to put up the marker.

For the September 13th MBGS meeting, we will hold our annual BBQ at MGRRE. We also discussed having a couple of in-person meetings at a college/university that is not in Lansing to get more student involvement. Chris C. will reach out to Calvin College.
